

LEARNING ACTION CELL SUMMIT 2021: 2nd CALABARZON SLAC DOCUFEST

To Schools Division Superintendents

- 1. In line with DepEd Order No. 35, s. 2016 also known as "The Learning Action Cell as a K to 12 Basic Education Program School-Based Continuing Professional Development Strategy for the Improvement of Teaching and Learning", Department of Education Region IV-A CALABARZON, through the Curriculum and Learning Management Division (CLMD), announces the conduct of the LEARNING ACTION CELL SUMMIT 2021: 2nd CALABARZON SLAC DOCUFEST, with the theme "Ensuring Quality Teaching and Learning in Changing Educational Paradigms" (Pagtiyak sa Kalidad ng Pagtuturo at Pagkatuto sa Nagbabagong mga Pang-Edukasyong Paradaym) on August 2-6, 2021.

Terms of Reference

A. Regional Technical Working Group (RTWG)

The RTWG shall:

- 1. Serve as the overall decision and policy making body;
- 2. Issue memorandum and related issuances regarding the conduct of the summit;
- Coordinate with the division CID & SGOD Chiefs regarding the schedule and other related information to ensure the smooth implementation of the docufest;
- Coordinate with the school heads on their SLAC challenges, best practices, projects, innovations and achievements in education amidst COVID-19 pandemic;
- 5. Provide technical assistance to the working committees and other individuals as needed; and
- 6. Facilitate the conduct of debriefing after the activity.

B. Docufest Program and Documentation Committee (DPDC)

The DPDC shall:

- 1. Prepare the posters and teaser of the activity;
- 2. Post and publish in the KRA 2 Learning Delivery FB Page the updates and guidelines of the activity;
- 3. Ensure that all the participants are able to submit complete and correct application requirements on or before the deadline of submissions;
- 4. Help the RTWG in the implementation of the program by serving as emcees and technical production team;
- 5. Coordinate with the RTWG on the needed materials for the activity;
- 6. Ensure that the activity is properly documented; and
- 7. Attend the debriefing session at the end of each day.

C. Curriculum Implementation Division (CID) and School Governance Operation Division (SGOD) Chiefs

The CID & SGOD Chiefs shall:

- Serve as process observers during the Program and Implementation Review (PIR) of the SLAC summit;
- 2. Ensure the implementation and monitoring of the LAC in their respective SDO;
- Collaborate with the RTWG in the implementation of the program by disseminating the regional memorandum and encouraging the schools in their SDO to participate in the activity; and
- 4. Attend and participate actively in the PIR of the SLAC summit.

D. Participants

The Participants shall:

1. Prepare and submit complete and correct application requirements on or before the deadline of submissions; and

2. Prepare and submit photo essay or short documentary film that meet the

documentary format as stated in the guidelines and mechanics; and 3. Faithfully follow the rules and guidelines on 2nd CALABARZON SLAC DOCUFEST 2021.

RULES AND GUIDELINES ON 2nd CALABARZON SLAC DOCUFEST 2021

Theme: Ensuring Quality Teaching and Learning in Changing Educational Paradigms (Pagtiyak sa Kalidad ng Pagtuturo at Pagkatuto sa Nagbabagong mga Pang-Edukasyong Paradaym)

As embedded in DepEd Order No. 35, s. 2016, Regional Offices shall conduct events that intend to highlight and bestow appropriate recognition to schools in terms of LAC accomplishments. Thus, this activity aims also to: a) identify schools that epitomize the improvement of learning outcomes, teachers' professional development, and professional collaborations amidst COVID-19 Pandemic through School Learning Action Cell (SLAC); b) showcase SLAC accomplishments through short documentary films and photo essays that contain the purpose, impact and implications of SLAC activities or practices to target beneficiaries; and c) provide opportunities to share best practices in SLAC in the entire region.

I. SLAC SHORT DOCUMENTARY FILM COMPETITION

A. Rules and Guidelines on SLAC Short Documentary Film Competition

By entering the competition, the participants agree to abide the competition guidelines and rules as follows:

- 1. All public schools in CALABARZON are eligible to submit ONE (1) entry in the contest.
- Members of the production team shall comprise of maximum of seven (7)
 members from the school's personnel with roles including but not limited to the
 following: director; scriptwriter; videographer; video editor; production
 designer; musical director, etc.
- 3. The submitted short documentary film that do not meet the documentary format as stated in the mechanics will be automatically disqualified.
- 4. The submitted documentary must not have been released on any platform, festival, or event before submission.
- Participants must submit complete and correct application requirements on or before the deadline of submissions. Films with incomplete requirements will not be accepted to apply.
- 6. The use of original literary sources, music materials, artwork, photography, etc., in the films, must have proper clearance from their respective copyright owners. The competition organizers shall not be liable for any costs related to claims of performing rights organizations.
- 7. Any modification will not be allowed for final entries except the addition of necessary subtitles.
- 8. Revised or re-submitted films, whether using the same or a different title, are not eligible to apply.
- 9. The organizers shall not be required to return any submitted material.
- 10. In case of any violation of the guidelines and rules or if any participant is found to have committed plagiarism or has undertaken fraudulent practice and/or activities harmful to the competition event or the submission process, the organizers reserve the right to disqualify the participant and their film, remove them from the program, or forfeit any prize from a participant at any point in the competition.

- 11. The SLAC Documentary Selection Committee will determine twenty (20) finalists.
- 12. The SLAC Documentary Jury will determine the winning films from the twenty (20) finalists. All entries will be judged based on the official given criteria.
- 13. R4A CLMD reserves the right to create, revoke, and modify at any time, in any way its entry requirements, rules, and regulations at its absolute discretion without prior notice. Finalists and submitted entries shall be bound by any amendments or addition to the entry requirements, rules and regulations herewith.
- 14. The decision of the SLAC Documentary Jury is final and irrevocable. The organizers and the judging committee are not obliged to explain the results.

- **File format:** Complete final cut must be submitted in 1080p, mp4 format, mixed in 5.1 audio format.

A. Rules and Guidelines on SLAC Photo Essay Contest

By entering the competition, the participants agree to abide the competition guidelines and rules as follows:

- 1. All public schools in CALABARZON are eligible to submit ONE (1) entry in the contest.
- 2. Participants shall create a photo essay that delineates outstanding or remarkable SLAC practices and/or accomplishments in their respective schools. It shall be composed of maximum of five (5) pictures only and laid out in 16:9 JPEG File with a resolution of 300ppi.
- 3. Participants are allowed to use any software or application for editing as long as the required format in number 2 has been met.
- Participants shall provide a maximum of three-paragraph essay (in MS Word file) describing the implementation of School Learning Action Cells and how it

helps teachers improve themselves in curriculum implementation, learning delivery, and others.

- 5. The participants shall provide the following information about their entries:
 - a. Title of the photo essay
 - b. Schools Division Office
 - c. District (if applicable)
 - d. School
 - e. Name of School Head
 - f. Name of author/participant
- 6. Entries shall be submitted via Google form which can be accessed in the link: https://bit.ly/R4ASLACphotoessay.
- 7. Entries with more than five (5) photos will be automatically disqualified.
- 8. Contestants must submit original photos and photographs should not contain watermarks or any identifying mark.
- 9. Committing or being engaged to Intellectual Property Rights infringement is subjected to disqualification of participants and entries.
- 10. The decision of the Photo Essay Jury is final and irrevocable. The organizers and the judging committee are not obliged to explain the results.


