GUIDELINES AND GROUND RULES

1. IAAF rules will be applied.
2. An athlete is eligible to compete in (3) individual events and (2) relays only
3. A team may enter 2 athletes only for Individual event.
4. All events are subject to change as the need arises.
5. Substitution must be done 15 minutes before the presentation of athletes must be accompanied by a medical certificate.
6. Entry form should be prepared in four copies by rank, from the fastest to lowest. Indicating no.1 as the fastest and no. 2 as the slowest. The form will be submitted to the chief of the clerk of course or to his/her duly authorized representative during the solidarity meeting.
7. All competitors must wear their delegation identity uniform and assigned athletes number (in front and back of the uniform) when reporting at the roll call area and during the competition proper.
8. No coaches or any party identified with an athlete is allowed in the vicinity of the playing area (with crowd control fence). If the rule will be violated a warning card (yellow card) will be showed to the concerned athlete and coach, and for the second time a red card will be shown and the athlete will be disqualified from the competition.
9. Using spike shoes and starting blocks is optional.
10. Athletes who will not perform/participate in his entered or qualified events cannot play anymore in his/her succeeding events (Law of succession).
11. In relays qualifiers can change runners a maximum of two (2).
12. In case of inclement weather where in an event cannot be safely completed, the coaches will be consulted prior to the postponement or cancelation of the schedule by the technical management based on the rule of majority.
13. In case of unfinished finals due to typhoon, ranking shall be based on the result of the time.
14. The starting height of the bar in high jump will be decided/ agreed upon by the coaches during the solidarity meeting.
15. All protest must be done in writing duly signed by the coaches and the head of the delegation.
16. Protest fee of 1,000.00 is required for every protest made, which is non-refundable if the protest is in vain.
17. For the safety of athletes in the 100 and 110 m. hurdles, the height of the hurdles will be the same with the 400 m. low hurdles height.

GUIDELINES AND GROUND RULES



1. DATE AND VENUE

The 2025 Division Athletic Association Meet (DAAM) Badminton Tournament will be held at Imus Drive and Smash Badminton Center Located at Lotus Mall, City of Imus on October 30, 2025.

2. RULES

- 2.1. The competition shall be held in accordance with the current Laws and Regulations of the Badminton World Federation (BWF). However, in matters not covered by these rules and regulations decision shall rest with the Tournament Director.
- 2.2 The Technical Committee / Tournament Director shall be responsible for the technical organization of the tournament. The decision of the committee in all matters regarding the competition shall be final.
- 2.3. Only coaches are allowed to approach the Match Control/Tournament Director with regards to clarifications, requests, protests, questions and inquiries during the match.

3. TOURNAMENT FORMAT

- 3.1. The format of the competition shall be run on a Single Elimination Best of 3 games for all events in Elementary and Secondary level both boys and girls. (Individual Entry and Team Tie if applicable.)

4. EVENTS

4.1 Individual Competition (Elementary / Secondary) Boys and Girls

5. TEAM COMPOSITION AND FIELDING OF PLAYER

- 5.1. A team must have a total of four (4) players for Boys and 4 players for Girls.
- 5.2. Each team shall consist of two (2) singles players and one (1) doubles (two players)
- 5.3. The order of plays shall be as follows – Single A, Singles B and Doubles.

6. ENTRY OF PLAYERS

- 6.1. Coaches shall submit their entries for Singles and Doubles to the Tournament Director / Tournament Secretary / Officials before the start of the matches.
- 6.2. The entries shall be duly signed by the coach.
- 6.3. Upon submission of the entries duly signed by the coach, *no substitution shall be allowed especially after the draw.*

7. SCORING

- 7.1 The BWF scoring system of 1 – 21 points (rally point) best of three games shall apply. In case the score becomes 20 all, the players/pair who gains an advance of two (2) points wins the game (22 – 20, 23 – 21) If the score becomes 29 –all, the player/ pair who scores the 30th point wins the game.

8. WALK-OVER

- 8.1 A five minute (5) grace period during match shall be given, otherwise the player shall be declared loser via walk-over.

9. ATTIRE

- 9.1 All players are required to use their playing uniform (Cluster colors especially on the first day of the games and on the Finals) or must be in a prescribed badminton uniform. Coaches / trainers should be in their Cluster uniform as well, whenever they're in the playing venue, most especially during their player's matches, sandals or "tsinelas" and sleeveless shirts or "sando". Otherwise, they will not be allowed to coach their players inside the venue.
- 9.2 Court officials shall wear the prescribed City Meet uniform and rubber shoes when officiating the matches.

10. PROTEST

- 10.1 Protest on eligibility will be settled at the level of the Organizing and Screening Committee.
- 10.2 Protest on technically will be settled at the level of the Tournament Director.

11. RESTRICTION FOR COACHES AND OFFICIALS

- 11.1 Court officials/coaches will not be allowed to officiate/coach in a match, if he/she is under the influence of liquor or controlled substances (illegal drugs)
- 11.2 Smoking is strictly prohibited within the playing area- lets us make badminton a smoke free competition.

12. RAAM SPORTS COMPETITION

- 12.1 Winners of the Individual Events (Boys Singles A/B; Girls Singles A/B ; Boys Doubles and Girls Doubles shall be represent the Regional Athletic Association (RAAM) 2026 at Batangas City.

13. UNFORSEEN EVENT

- 13.1 The Decision of the Tournament Director or any dispute during the competition shall be final.
- 13.2 If the on-going tie's/matches will be continued later from the point where it was disputed, the current scores shall stand.

14. ASSIGNING THE WINNING COACH AND CHAPERON

- 14.1 The Coach of the Division with the winning Doubles in the Individual Event, will be the winning coach and will be chosen to accompany the players to the RAAM Competition 2026. In the event that both singles players (Singles A and Singles B of a Division delegation will be the winning coach. The chaperon will be taken from the Division with Second Place status (Runners-up) for the Girls' Team shall be a female .

BASKETBALL



GUIDELINES AND GROUND RULES

(The International Basketball Federation (FIBA) Rules-valid as of 1st of October 2024 shall govern the basketball competitions of Division Athletic Association Meet 2025.

I. TITLE: ELEMENTARY AND BOYS/GIRLS SECONDARY BASKETBALL

It is a game specially designed to build a strong foundation in developing basketball awareness among participating teams. It also aims to develop the basic skills and character among young athletes *providing unique experience for fun, enjoyment and eventually leading the way to a long term involvement in sports.*

II. SPECIAL OBJECTIVE OF THE GAME

To throw the ball in the playmates basket and to prevent the players of the other team from securing the ball or scoring based on the fair play and within the spirit and intent of the rules. The game shall be DEVELOPMENTAL in nature and approach.

To enhance camaraderie, goodwill, sportsmanship, discipline, teamwork and other life skills value inherent in the practice and participation in sports.

III. TEAM (PLAYERS, COACHES AND OTHER TEAM OFFICIALS)

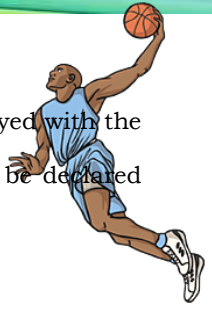
1. ELIGIBILITY
 - 1.1 Based on the Palarong Pambansa Guidelines
2. TEAM COMPOSITION
 - 2.1 A team shall be composed of not more 12 team members and a coach, while the girls' Division may include a chaperon if the head coach is male.
3. COACH
 - 3.1 A team shall be headed by a RESPONSIBLE COACH as required by the Palarong Pambansa Rules and Guidelines.
 - 3.2. Only the coach (and the chaperon shall be allowed to stay within the team bench during the official games.

IV. TIME REGULATIONS

1. The game shall consist of 4 periods. The first three periods and the first eight (8) minutes of the fourth (4) period will be running time and stop time under last two (2) minutes of the last period
2. Five (5) timeouts per game, 2 time outs for 1st half & 3 timeouts for the final half. Timeouts for 1st half not be carry over for the final half.
3. The interval between periods is one (1) minute while the interval between halves is five (5) minutes.
4. Forfeiture time of 15 minutes grace period will be given.

V. PLAYERS' PLAYING REGULATIONS

1. For elementary level only:
 1. All players (Elem and Secondary) of the team shall be fielded before the end of the second period of within the first half.
 2. All players shall play at least one (1) period but not more than three (3) periods and must be rested for one (1) period.
If a coach fielded more three periods, it shall be penalized with a **Technical Foul** (1 FT + BP) charged to the coach.
 3. Normal substitution procedures shall apply in all periods (Elem/Sec). A player may enter in a game as a substitute as many times as possible within that period and considered as having played in that period/quarter.
 4. One (1) time out for every period shall be granted to each team for the first three (3) periods and two (2) time-outs shall be granted in the fourth period, and one (1) time-out for every extra period. Unused time-out(s) may not be carried over the next period. In the first three periods the time-out shall be either used or forfeited.



5. In case the team has an incomplete line-up during the scheduled game:

- The 1st period shall always start with five (5) players while the other periods may be played with the remaining members of the team.
- a team with only seven (7) players (physically present) at the start of the game shall be declared LOSER BY FORFEIT.

For secondary (boys and girls)

- The official FIBA RULES shall apply.

VI. OFFICIAL JERSEY AND BALL

A. The jersey number of players may start at 4 to 15; hence no players shall have a duplicated number.

B. The official ball to be used for elementary/secondary girls shall be BG4500 (6) and BG4500 (7) for secondary boys.

VII. IN CASE OF DISQUALIFICATION:

- A thrown-out player must leave the confines of the playing area.
- A player/coach who is disqualified as a result of disqualifying foul/fighting or like, subject will be automatically suspended. The number of games of suspension shall be determined by the technical committee and will be based on the gravity of the act.
- 1 game suspension for the player based on the call/scenario as recommended by officiating officials.

VIII. RULES AND CONDUCT

1. FOULS

TECHNICAL FOUL- any PLAYER/COACH who displays unsportsmanlike/disrespectful act such as slashing of neck, showing of dirty finger, pointing of accusing finger and trash talking/shouting bad/foul language, contesting calls, arguing with the officials and other. A warning may be given, or a technical foul shall be SLAPPED.

PERSONAL FOULS-a player causing contact with the opposing playmate, which give an unfair disadvantage, such contact are neither intentional nor flagrant.

FLAGRANT FOULS-a player causing excessive contact which may cause or have caused injury to an opponent, such as:

- Excessive swinging of elbow
- Throwing a punch
- Tripping
- Intentional contact/pushing the back of a player going for a basket shall be judge to an UNSPORTSMANLIKE/DISQUALIFYING FOUL.

IX. PLAYERS'/COACHES' CONDUCT

A. A player/coach, who is slapped with a DISQUALIFYING FOUL and ejected because of FLAGRANTLY UNSPORTSMANLIKE ACTION, shall be penalized accordingly and with an additional 1-game suspension/ total disqualification or banned for further participation, depending on the gravity of the offense. (as may be determined by the technical committee).

B. Uttering/shouting of obscene/foul/bad language/words or verbal abuse from players/coaches to opponents/officials or teammates shall not be tolerated. Such act shall be dealt with a WARNING or TECHNICAL FOUL and three (3) minute rest.

C. Teams shall keep and leave their bench areas clean and orderly. Non-compliance shall be dealt with a WARNING for the first offense. TECHNICAL FOUL for the second offense.

D. Coaches shall always confirm their next schedule of game with the TOURNAMENT MANAGER OR THE CHIEF REFEREE before leaving the playing venue or after the game.

E. Games which are cancelled/disrupted/stopped due to "FORCE MAJEURE" or valid reason, will be treated in the following manner.

1. REMATCH- if the disruption of the game took place during the first half (first and second period) games shall be played.

2. RESUMPTION- if the disruption of the game took place during the second half (3rd and 4th period) game shall be resumed with the remaining game time.

3. RESET- if the schedule was cancelled for valid reason, the Tournament Director will schedule the game at the bottom of all schedules.

4. DURATION OF WAITING- in case of power failure or any incident (rain or darkness) that may affect the progress of the game, the length of time to wait for the restoration of normalcy is 30 minute or as may be allowed by.

X. TOURNAMENT FORMAT BASKETBALL BOYS/GIRLS (5X5) & (3X3)

A. Double Elimination format shall be applied

B. Rank 1 & 2 will be seeded based from the results of the last DAAM. In case Rank 2 failed to qualify this DAAM Rank 3 placed Rank 2 in the seeding.

C. Rule of game succession will be observed with ten (10) minutes interval between games.

D. Champion team will represent Imus City to Regional Athletic Association Meet.



GUIDELINES AND GROUND RULES

1. DATE AND VENUE

The 2025 Division Athletic Association Meet (DAAM) Billiard Tournament will be held at Kim Home Billiard 3, Located at Raf Commercial Building, Carsadang Bago 2, City of Imus on October 29-30, 2025.

2. RULES

2.1 The competition shall be held in accordance with the current Laws and Regulations of the World Pool Association (WPA) and Palarong Pambansa Guide book 2017.

2.2 The Technical Committee/Tournament Director shall be responsible for the technical organization of the tournament. The decision of the committee in all matters regarding the competition shall be final.

2.3 The players are not allowed to approach the TD during the game competition.

2.4 Only the coaches are allowed to approach the TD/Officials with regards to clarifications, request, protest and inquiries during the match.

3. TOURNAMENT FORMAT

3.1. The format of the competition shall be run on a Single Elimination or Knock-out game.

4. EVENTS

4.1 Individual Competition (Secondary) Boys and Girls

* 9 Balls (Two (2) entries /Cluster)

* 8 Balls (Two (2) entries / Cluster)

5. TEAM COMPOSITION AND FIELDING OF PLAYER

5.1. A team must have a total of two (2) players for Boys and two (2) players for Girls.

5.2. The order of the plays shall be as follows, 9 Balls Boys, 9 Balls Girls, 8 Balls Boys and 8 Balls Girls.

6. ENTRY OF PLAYERS

6.1. Coaches shall submit their entries to the Tournament Secretary before the start of the game.

6.2. The entries shall be duly signed by the coach.

6.3. Upon submission of the entries duly signed by the coach, *no substitution shall be allowed especially after the draw.*

7. SCORING

7.1. Five racks, raise to three

8. WALK-OVER

8.1. A five minute (5) grace period during the game shall be given, otherwise the player shall be declared loser via walk-over.

9. ATTIRE

9.1. Cluster uniform, Long Pants, Black shoes/ shoes with rubber soles

10. PROTEST

10.1. All protest must be submitted to the tournament Director in writing 30 minutes after the posting of the results by the official team coach only.

10.2. If a player needs a decision to be taken, the first person to be contacted is the referee. The referee will form his decision by all means that seem suitable to him. If the player wants to protest against that ruling, he may contact the TD. In any regular tournament, the TD decision is binding and final.

11. RESTRICTION FOR COACHES

11.1. No coaching during the match/game

11.2. Coach are not allowed the referee during the match/game

11.3. Silence in the playing venue

12. ASSIGNING THE WINNING COACH AND CHAPERON

12.1. In assigning the winning coach, the pointing system will be applied.

BOCCE

GUIDELINES AND GROUND RULES

1. *Knock out Game.*
2. *Coaching from outside and inside the court is strictly prohibited.*
3. *Coaches are not permitted to coach athlete during the game.
If they persist to do so, they will be warned and possibly asked to leave the playing area.*
4. *The court fields are for athletes only, the coaches may stand/sit in any designated areas end of courts, far side of playing area.*
5. *Singles will be played by one boy and one girl.*
6. *Each athlete can participate in no more than two (2) Events.*
7. *Doubles and Team events (mixed gender)*
8. *In Doubles or Team rotation of players can be in any order as long as each athlete only rolls 2 balls/ 1 ball.*
9. *The official will only say Red/ Green to play and indicate by Flag color/paddle.*
10. *Foot line referees will call all foot line violations.*
11. *Measuring of the ball is upon the discretion of the referee.*
12. *Attire: Proper attire – players will dress in a manner which will bring credit to them and the sport of Bocce.*
13. *Footwear: Players will not be permitted to play without shoes.*
14. *The First Team/ Player to reach points wins.*

16 points – Team

If there's a tie only one ball will be given.

15. *A time limit of 8 minutes per game is in effect at Singles, 10 minutes for Doubles and 12 minutes for Team. All points are scored in the final frame.*
16. *Five seconds will be given to release the ball if the player is delaying the game.*
17. *Winner of the Team Event will be the representative in the higher meet.*
18. *Health protocol must be strictly followed.*
19. *Taking videos while game is ongoing is strictly not allowed.*

CHESS

GUIDELINES AND GROUND RULES

1. TEAM COMPOSITION

- Elementary – 2 Boys and 2 Girls
- Secondary – 3 Boys and 3 Girls

2. TIME CONTROL

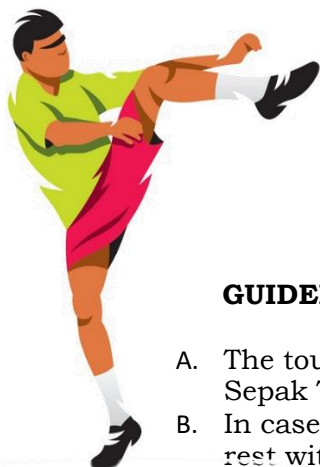
- Standard game - one (1) hour for each player
- Blitz game – 5 mins. Without increment
- Use of clock shall be mandatory
- NO DEFAULTING TIME

3. TOUCH MOVE SYSTEM shall be applied to all players.

4. Notation of Movement – Mandatory

5. APPLICATION OF DRAW

- PERPETUAL CHECK - the game shall be considered draw if the requesting athlete/player shall prove it in writing or NOTATION or he/she shall show it again the movements (perpetual moves) to the arbiter as conformed by his/her opponent.
- THEORETICAL DRAW – The arbiter shall claim/ consider the game draw as book draw.
- NO MATING PIECES – example: King only, King and knight only, king and bishop only, king and two knights only.
- FIFTY MOVES (50) without capturing of pieces and pawn movement.
- ARTICLE 10, ALTERNATIVE 2, SECTION A – states/explains that the player is making **NO effort** to win the game by normal means or it is not possible to win by normal means.



SEPAK TAKRAW

GUIDELINES AND GROUND RULES

- A. The tournament shall be run in accordance with the rules of the International Sepak Takraw Federation (ISTAF, Sepak takraw- Law of the Game 2024.
- B. In case of problems not covered by the existing ISTAF rules, the final decision shall rest with the Tournament Director.
- C. The tournament shall be played in Toclong Elementary School
- D. Each team, referred to as "Team" shall comprise three Regus, and shall consist of a minimum of nine players and a maximum of twelve players.
(*Secondary*)
- E. Each team, referred to as "Team" shall comprise one Regu, and shall consist of a minimum of three players and a maximum of four players. (*Elementary*)
- F. Each player shall be permitted to play for only one Regu in any Team Match.
- G. Each Regu shall consist of a minimum of three players and a maximum of five players
(1 Regu of 3 players plus 2 reserves) all of whom must be registered.
- H. Players are not allowed to play in more than one Regu in any Team Event.
- I. Substitution of a player shall be permitted at any time by showing the Substitution Card to the Referee when the ball is not in play. The Substitution Card shall indicate the jersey number of the outgoing player.
- J. In each Regu, two Substitutions may be permitted in each set. The player who has been substituted earlier shall be allowed to re-enter the same set. One or two substitutions may be made at the same time for both Team and Regu event competitions.
- K. Service shall alternate thereafter every one (1) point, regardless of which side wins the point.
- L. At deuce (when both sides reaches 14-14), the service shall remain alternate at every point made.
- M. Each set is won by the Regu which scores fifteen (15) points.
- N. In the event of a score of 14-14, the set shall be won when a side reaches seventeen (17) points. In such a situation, the Referee shall announce "Setting up to seventeen (17) points".
- O. Each Regu shall be entitled to one time-out for a period of not exceeding one minute in each set.
- P. Only the Team Manager or the Coach may call for time-out only when the ball is not in play.
- Q. Rule of succession is applied. Fifteen (15) minutes grace period will be given to the team after the last or conclusion of the last match following their game schedule.
- R. In the event of any question or any matter arising out of any point, which is not expressly provided for in any rules of the game, the decision of the Official Referee shall be final.

SWIMMING

GUIDELINES AND GROUND RULES

1. COMPETITION RULES

- FINA rules will be applied. Ground rules which have been agreed upon shall be implemented.
- ONE START rule.
- Competition will be in timed finals format.
- Each swimmer is allowed to swim five (5) individual events and two (2) relay events.
- Each cluster is allowed to enter two (2) swimmers per individual events and one (1) relay team in the relay events.
- A swimmer who fails to swim an event will not be allowed to swim his succeeding events for that session unless otherwise that swimmer submits a medical report from the DAAM Official Medical Physician
- Only athletes, coaches and Delegation Officials with official identification tags will be allowed at areas designated for delegates.

2. RELAY ENTRY

2.1 Relay entries and names of swimmers in order of swim must be submitted in the master list of entries

2.2 Indicate in the of swim by numbering swimmers 1-4 in the official entry.

3. PROTESTS

All protests must be submitted to the referee in writing thirty (30) minutes after the posting of the results by the official team coach only.

4. TIMING

Official manual time of a swimmer shall be determined as follows:

- 4.1.1 If in case that the time of the first is higher than the time of the second swimmer, average time of the swimmers involved will be the official of both swimmers.
- 4.1.2 Official placing will be decided by the referee based on facts and a referee's (RD) at the official result.

5. TEAM COMPOSITION

Number of swimmers per delegation will be as follows:

Elementary -10 male 10 female

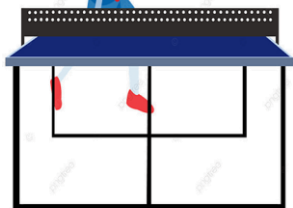

GUIDELINES AND GROUND RULES



1. The tournament will be a SINGLE ROUND ROBIN system.
2. The player or pair will play best of 3-best of 5 eliminations and Championship.
3. In the event of triple tie or a tie in team standings, the "win over the other" rule and the quotient system shall be applied.
4. Each player or pair has an opportunity of 2 services except for the deuce with 1 service only.
5. Services shall be with the ball resting freely or the open palm of the server's stationary free hand.
6. The server's free arm shall be removed from the space between the ball and the net right after the release.
7. The service shall then project the ball near vertically upward without impacting anything before being struck.
8. The ball that touches anything rather than the table, the score will be awarded to the opponent.
10. The ball that failed to hit after the release, the score is awarded to the opponent.
11. Scores will be given to a clearly illegal, fault.
 - Moved table
 - Obstruction
 - Double bounce
 - Double hit
 - Wrong receiver
 - Wrong side
 - Ball is hidden
 - Hand on the table
 - Wrong server
 - Not high enough
 - palm not open
 - Ball resting on fingers
 - Below the playing area
 - Inside the end line
 - Not vertically
12. The racket shall have an ITTF mark.
13. The racket shall NOT be replaced during the game, unless it is accidentally damaged so badly that it cannot be used, but must be replaced within the playing venue
9. Players shall leave the rackets and the ball on the table during intervals and time out.
10. A game shall be won by the first player or pair subsequently gaining a lead of 2 points.
11. The players or pairs are entitled to practice on the match table for 2 minutes before the start of a match but not during normal intervals.
12. Two minute-practice during the change of racket or ball will be given to the players.
13. A player or pair may claim one time-out period for 1 minute during an individual match.
14. A player is not allowed to catch the ball if ever it is outside.
15. Five (5) minutes will be given if there is an injury if the player cannot play after the given time; the match will be awarded to his/her opponent.
16. Individual events can receive advices only to the coach or designated person only.
17. Advices must be made during time out or intervals only and NOT during the game.
18. Default game is 15 minutes.
19. Yellow and Red Card will be awarded for the misbehaviour of players, coaches and spectators
 - A. Yellow Card for first offense
 - B. Yellow and Red Card for the second offense with 1 point to the opponent
 - C. Yellow and Red Card for the third offense with 2 points to the opponent
20. Deciding game – score reach to 5
 - A. Singles – Change ends
 - B. Doubles – Scores of 5-0, 5-2, 5-4 change end, change receiver, same server
 - C. Doubles – Scours of 5-1, 5-3 change end, change receiver, change server
21. During doubles, players A & B vs. player's X & Y: First set service A – receiver X, during Second set the pair will be ask if who among them would like to serve; if X wish to serve the receiver will be A, but if Y wish to serve the receiver will be B, same to the following sets.
22. Venue – Imus Pilot Elementary School

- The tournament format will be a SINGLE ROUND ROBIN (SRR) system.

I. COMPETITION ATTIRE AND EQUIPMENT

COMPETITORS:

1. Competitors shall wear at least taekwondo uniform or the official competition uniform and equipment. These include the following:
Competition uniform (white with blue for boys, white with red for girls) with black belts, junior black belts or competition belts.
2. Coaches are required to wear the following. Collared and sleeved shirt. Official delegation uniform.

II. COMPETITION MECHANICS

METHOD OF COMPETITION:

1. Individual competition between competitors of the same category.
2. Competitors can only join one category per event.
3. The competition will follow the Single Elimination Tournament System.
4. For poomsae and kyorugi strictly imposed NO PLAY, NO MEDAL policy.
5. No Groin guard, No mouthpiece, No game/play.
6. The competition will use the Best of Three (3) system (see III. COMPETITION, Winning a Match, Best of Three System)

7. Ground rules to follow: PALARONG PAMBANSA 2025 – Technical Guidelines for Taekwondo

1. There will be a division between male and female competitors
2. Each division is separated into different categories

3. No parents allowed during weigh-in. 4. Only the official coach will be entertained during the weigh-in and height-in.
5. No wearing of revealing clothes (bra, sports bra, under garments, boxer, etc.). Only dobok, t-shirts and shorts.
6. During weigh-in 2 weighing scale will be allotted. 1 for the checking of weight (trial) and 1 for final weight.

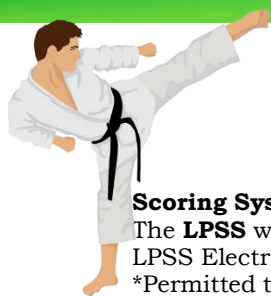

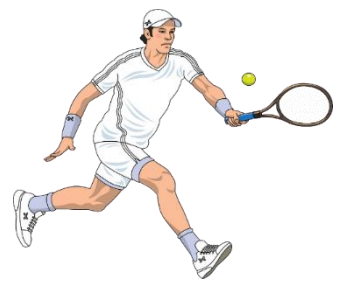

ELIGIBILITY

Players must be officially enrolled for the school year 2025-2026 duly certified by the school registrar/principal. Must be born 2008 onward.

TEAM COMPOSITION

Team will be allowed to have a maximum of 12 players (inclusive of Libero). A coach, assistant coach, chaperon (for girls volleyball only), and school principal.

Only those above mentioned will be allowed to sit on their bench during actual games.

Team will not be allowed to play without authorized team official/s.

A misrepresentation on the team's line-up is subject to DISQUALIFICATION.

UNIFORMS

Players must play in their official playing uniforms; Number must be printed front and back for the upper jersey, any player can use any numbers from 1 – 22.

Dress code for team officials: Collared shirts or official uniform for coach and assistant coach supplied by the school. Long pants, leather or rubber shoes.

TOURNAMENT FORMAT

6 teams (2 Private school and 4 public school)

Elimination (Single Round Robin)

Two-out-three sets per match, 25 points per sets/deciding sets 25 points only

- If two (2) or more teams are tied on the number of points gained, they will be classified in descending order by the quotient resulting from the division of the number of all sets won by the number of all sets lost. (Team involve only)

PROTEST

In case of protest, the team captain should sign and note the scoresheets before the game and must be provide a letter of protest within 48 hours.

DEFAULTS

For the 1st match only, the team that does not appear fifteen (15) minutes after the schedule time of their game shall be declared default in Favor of the opposing team.

For the succeeding games, a total of 20 minutes (5 minutes game interval and 15 minutes after protocol) will be given to the team coming in late to be considered as DEFAULT.

Game succession will be applied.

PENALTIES AND TECHNICALITIES

1. No changing of team line up once the teams are screened.
2. No Coach No Play
3. Play All System
4. Coaches are required to wear a proper attire. NO T-shirts, Sando, Jacket/warmer, Caps, Shorts and Slippers. Collared uniform or Jersey uniform is allowed.
5. Complete uniform must be required to all the schools participants(same upper jersey and shorts)
6. Exchange of Uniform and Jersey # is NOT ALLOWED, NO FIXED LIBERO
7. Only the TEAM/GAME CAPTAIN can approach the referee to clarify calls or decision.
8. The Coach and Team Captain are required to sign the scoresheet.
9. FIVB rules of the game will be imposed in this competition.

GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR SPORTS EVENT SCREENING

I. During the Lower Meet/Division Meet

1. The School Sports Coordinators/ coaches shall submit the Master list of athletes per event with grade level and school, including the names of the coaches on their scheduled medical-physical examination.
2. On Medical-Physical Examination
 - a. All athletes must bring Medical Certificate Form 1, Medical Certificate Form 2, Parents' Consent, and PSA Birth Certificate. The Division Screener will share the Medical Certificate Forms through the coaches of different events.
 - b. The coaches, assistant coaches, and chaperones must bring Medical Certificate Form 3.

II. During Regional Meet/ Palarong Pambansa

1. The master list of athletes from the Regional Screening and Accreditation Committee (RSAC) shall be released through the Regional Memorandum.
2. For screening during these events, the same Medical Certificate Forms 1 & 2 of athletes and Medical Certificate Form 3 of coaches utilized from the Lower Meet and Division Meet will be used.

III. Other considerations

1. Medical Certificate o A medical certificate duly signed by the physician, stating that the athlete is physically fit, is valid three (3) months before the opening of each level of competition. The complete name and signature of the physician shall appear on the medical certificate, with the license number and date of examination.

2. Dental Certificate o A dental certificate duly signed by the dentist, stating that the athlete is orally fit, is valid six (6) months before the opening of each level of competition. The complete name and signature of the dentist shall appear on the dental certificate, with the corresponding license number and date of examination. For the secondary level, no dental certificate is required.

Otherwise, the form will be invalid.
- At the completion, the four levels of sport events (School/ Intrams/ District Meet; Division Meet; Regional Meet; and Palarong Pambansa), must be duly signed with the complete name of the health professionals attending per sport screening level with their PRC license numbers.

Nurses attending per level shall place their initials near the vital signs. o Indicate in the “Remarks”, the maintenance medicines and other notable observations, e.g. abnormal BPs after three (3) recordings will result in referral to a specialist for clearance.

2. Medical Certificate Form 2- Medical History

- Name and birthdate must be typewritten; and NSAC watermark must be embedded for the same condition as MC Form 1. The signature of parent/guardian and athlete must be affixed to the form. Otherwise, the form will be invalid.
- At the completion, signature with complete name of the health professionals attending per sport screening level (School/ Intrams/ District Meet; Division Meet; Regional Meet; and Palarong Pambansa), their PRC license numbers, and the date of signing must be affixed to this form.
- Refer to the specialist for clearance once with the following observations/findings:
 - a. If with history of illness/ injury that will affect game performance;
 - b. If pregnant, refer to Obstetrician-Gynecologist (OB) for “Fit to Play”
 - c. For Basketball, Wushu, Taekwondo, if with sign and symptoms of Hernia or history of Hernia, refer to surgeon;
 - d. If with history of sprain, ligament tear, injury, fracture during the previous sport events, refer to orthopedic surgeon;
 - e. Do Visual Acuity Test for those who answer YES to history of wearing glasses (Snellens) MC Form 2 at the District Level.

3. Medical Certificate Form 3- Athletes, Coaches, Chaperones

- Name, age, sex, and sport event must be typewritten; and NSAC watermark must be embedded or overlaid on the main content to indicate authenticity. Otherwise, the form will be invalid.
- At the completion, the four levels of sport events (School/ Intrams/ District Meet; Division Meet; Regional Meet; and Palarong Pambansa), must be duly signed with the complete name of the health professionals attending per sport screening level with their PRC license numbers.
- Nurses attending per level shall place their initials near the vital signs.
- Indicate in the “Remarks”, the maintenance medicines, and other notable observations, e.g. an abnormal BPs even after three (3) recordings will result in referral to a specialist for clearance.

All Technical Officials should submit their MC Form 3-Medical Clearances as a group of the delegation to the RSAC medical committee. In this form, only the Medical Officer will sign.

4. Medical Clearance o No pregnant athlete will be allowed to participate o Secure clearances for the following:

- a. *Fit to Participate* from Obstetrician-Gynecologist for Pregnant officials and chaperones;
- b. *Fit to Play* from Orthopedic Physician, specifically if they have fractures that occurred within 6 months or remain symptomatic;
- c. *Neurologic Clearance* from Neurologist, for Seizures, previous head injury/trauma
- d. *Medical or Endocrine Clearance* from Family Medicine Physician or Internal Medicine Physician or Endocrinologist for hypertension, coronary heart disease, arrhythmia, diabetes, thyroid disorders and immunocompromised illnesses.

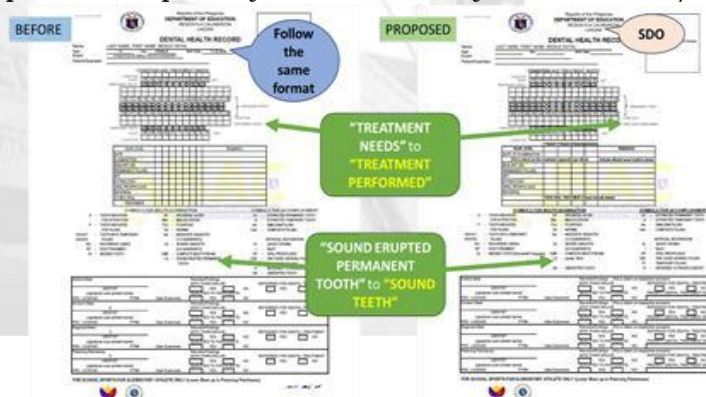
Additional documents for athletes in Special Sports Events for SWDL

- a. Intellectual Disability Certification
- Psycho- Educational Assessment Tests conducted and certified by Psychologist or DepEd SPED Supervisor indicating the Athlete's IQ level (70 and below)
- b. Visual Impairment Certification
 - Test conducted and certified by an Ophthalmologist to determine the visual acuity (Totally Blind or Low Vision); and
- c. Hearing Impairment Certification
 - Test conducted and certified by an Otorhinolaryngologist to determine that the athlete is unable to hear.
 - The Attending Medical Officer shall have the final decision in managing the athlete or delegate

DENTAL GUIDELINES FOR SPORTS EVENT SCREENING

I. Filling out of Dental Form for Screening 1. Dental Health Record o Follow the same format except for the revisions/ changes in the following in the **Updated Dental Health Record**:

- a. Change “Treatment Needs” to “Treatment Performed” since the “Treatment Needs” can be identified in the dental chart and also indicated under the item “Findings”.
- b. “Sound Erupted Permanent Tooth” to “Sound Teeth” because of the possibility of presence of primary teeth which may also be sound/ intact or without defect/ caries.



GUIDELINES PATTERNED TO PALARONG PAMBANSA

- Please ensure that you note the Schools Division Office (SDO) to which the athlete belongs in the Dental Health Record for accurate documentation.
- The following information must be typewritten: the participant's name, age, sex, and the sport event. The National Screening and Accreditation Committee (NSAC) watermark must be embedded or overlaid on the main content to indicate authenticity. Additionally, only one specific form should be used for all levels of sport events; otherwise, the form will be considered invalid.
- For the item "Name", please follow the format: "Last Name, First Name, Middle Initial."
- In the table referring to the educational level of the athlete participant, always indicate the "Year Level" and the "Date of Examination" per event meet, i.e., under the column "Lower/ District", if the dental examination is done during the Lower/ District Meet. Follow the same procedure for the succeeding activities such as Division Meet, Regional Meet and Palarong Pambansa.

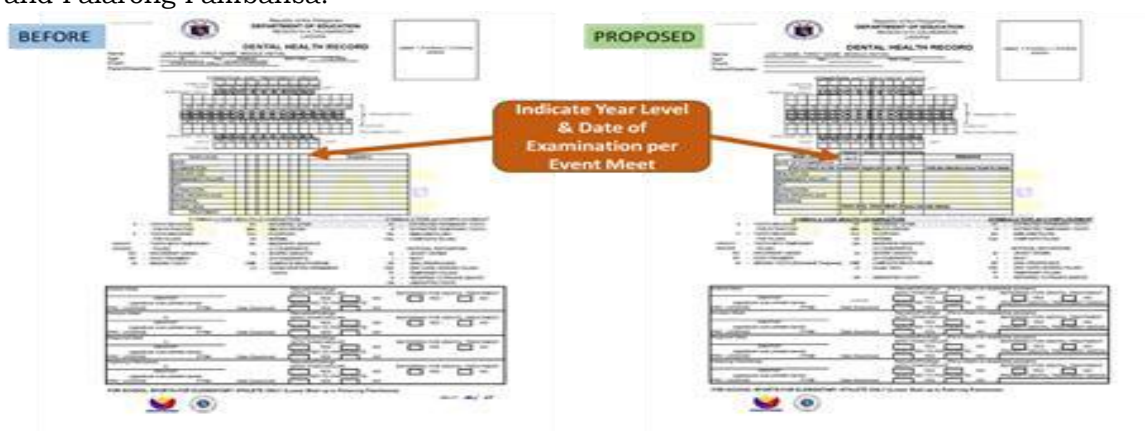


Figure 2. Grade Level and Date of Examination

- Place a checkmark (✓) next to the treatment requested for each sport event screening. Options include: Sealant, Permanent Filling, ART, Extraction, Oral Prophylaxis, and Referral. Under the item "Remarks", indicate the areas/ tooth numbers affected or need dental management/ treatment.
- In the last table, write down the dentist's name and sign above the printed name. FILL IN ONLY the meetings attended and always indicate the date of examination, and the PRC License to make it valid. For the Remarks/Findings section, it is required to check (✓) the appropriate responses or provide details as necessary.

II. Dental Screening

1. Dental screenings will begin at the Lower Meet and will be conducted for elementary-level athletes only.
2. Take note in the Dental Health Record Form if the athlete is wearing braces or orthodontic appliances. It is important to request Dental Clearance, particularly if the athlete is participating in combative/ contact sports that could increase the risk of injury or complications due to accidental contact or trauma to the oral tissues during play.
3. Indicate whether the third molar, commonly known as the wisdom tooth, is unerupted (UN) or put a check (✓) to confirm its presence or eruption in the Dental Health Record Form of the elementary athlete. Elementary athletes with 3rd molar are automatically disqualified, as its presence is one of the factors that determine if the athlete is overage for the sport they are participating in.¹
4. For the purpose of standardization and uniformity, always use "D" for decayed tooth.

GUIDELINES ON THE ELIGIBILITY OF ATHLETES IN THE DIVISION, REGIONAL AND PALARONG PAMBANSA 2025

RULE I

Section 1. Scope and Application - These Rules shall apply to the conduct of the Palarong Pambansa, Regional, Division, District, and School Meets.

RULE II

Section 2. Composition

a. Pursuant to Section 13 of Republic Act No. 10588,1 known as "An Act Institutionalizing the Conduct of the Palarong Pambansa and Appropriating Funds Therefor" and Section 17 (a) of DepEd Order No. 43, s. 2016, known as "The Implementing Rules and Regulations of Republic Act No. 10588,"2 the Board shall constitute the National Screening and Accreditation Committee (NSAC) composed of the following:

- i. *A representative from DepEd Legal and Legislative Affairs;*
- ii. *Two (2) government physicians;*
- iii. *Two (2) government dentists; and*
- iv. *One (1) authorized representative from each Regional Athletic Association (RAA), preferably the Chairperson of the Regional Screening and Accreditation Committee (RSAC).*

The Palaro Board may designate a Data Group/Secretariat that will assist the NSAC in preparing and reproducing the master lists, and photo galleries of the athletes, coaches, assistant coaches, and chaperones, and other works as deemed necessary. **b.** The Regional Director, in consultation with the members of the RAA, shall create a Regional Screening and Accreditation Committee (RSAC) composed of the following:

- i. *A representative from the Regional Legal Unit or a representative authorized by the Regional Director, who will act as the Chairperson;*
- ii. *Two (2) government physicians;*
- iii. *Two (2) government dentists;*
- iv. *One (1) authorized representative from each Division Athletic Association (DAA); and v. Data Group that will serve as the secretariat and assist the RSAC in the preparation and submission of the master list, and photo galleries, and other documents of the athletes, coaches, assistant coaches, and chaperones.*

c. The Schools Division Superintendent shall likewise create a Division Screening and Accreditation Committee (DSAC) composed of the following:

- i. A representative from the Legal Unit or a representative authorized by the Schools Division Superintendent, who will act as the Chairperson;
 - ii. One (1) government physician;
 - iii. One (1) government dentist;
 - iv. One (1) authorized representative from each district or cluster and v. Data Group that will serve as the secretariat and assist the DSAC in the preparation and submission of the master list, and photo galleries, and other documents of the athletes, coaches, assistant coaches, and chaperones.
- d.** No teaching personnel engaged in classroom instruction shall be designated as NSAC, RSAC, or DSAC members.

Section 3. Duties and Functions of the NSAC - The NSAC shall:

- a.** Interview, evaluate, and verify the authenticity of the documents of athletes, coaches, assistant coaches, and chaperones submitted by the Head of Delegation for the Palarong Pambansa;
- b.** Accredite qualified athletes, coaches, assistant coaches, and chaperones and submit to the Board: i. the initial master list at least two (2) months before the conduct of the Palarong Pambansa; ii. the final official master list at least two (2) days before the conduct of the Palarong Pambansa;
- c.** Consider replacements for disqualified athletes during the period of screening;
- d.** Re-check and monitor with the proper technical officials the athlete fielded by coaches during the actual competition based on the final official master list with photo gallery released by NSAC;
- e.** Monitor the conduct of the screening and accreditation of the athletes, coaches, assistant coaches, and chaperones during the Division, Regional and Palarong Pambansa;
- f.** Have appellate jurisdiction on decisions rendered by RSAC; and
- g.** Other functions that the Board may delegate.

GUIDELINES PATTERNED TO PALARONG PAMBANSA

Section 4. Duties and Functions of the RSAC and DSAC - The RSAC and DSAC shall:

- a. Evaluate and verify the authenticity of the documents of athletes, coaches, assistant coaches, and chaperones submitted by the Head of Delegation for the Regional Meet in the case of RSAC and Division Meet in the case of DSAC;
- b. Accredited qualified athletes, coaches, assistant coaches, and chaperones and submit the master list to the RAA, DAA or Provincial Athletic Association (PAA), through the Tournament Managers, as the case may be, at least two (2) days before the conduct of the Division or Regional Meet;
- c. Re-check and monitor with the proper technical officials the athletes fielded by the coaches during the actual competition based on the final official master list and photo gallery;
- d. The Head of Delegation, through the DSAC or RSAC, shall submit the master list to the RSAC or NSAC, as the case may be;
- e. Provide technical assistance in the screening and accreditation of athletes, coaches, assistant coaches, and chaperones.

RULE III

Section 5. Rules on Participation in the Palarong Pambansa

- a. The participants in the Palarong Pambansa shall be elementary and secondary athletes from public and private schools who participated in the Division meet (School, District, and other applicable meets) and Regional Meet: Provided that secondary athletes shall refer to both junior and senior high school learners;
 - b. Generally, Kinder to Grade 6 athletes shall play in the elementary Division, and Grade 7 to Grade 12 athletes shall play in the secondary Division.
- However, an elementary athlete who has been declared overage at the elementary level may be allowed to play at the secondary level.

Section 6. Eligibility of Athlete - To be eligible in the Palarong Pambansa, Regional, Division, and other lower meets, the athlete must be:

- a. A Filipino citizen;
 - b. Enrolled in a public, private recognized school (schools with recognition/permit to operate) or Philippine School Overseas (PSO) or National Academy of Sports (NAS) at the beginning of the current school year and have attended and/or completed the curriculum year (for Palarong Pambansa only), regardless of the delivery mode of learning, except those enrolled under Alternative Learning System. For athletes under the Alternative Delivery Mode (Home Study Program/ Home Schooling Program, Modified Out School Approach, Open High School Program), they shall be allowed to participate in the lower meets, Division, Regional, and Palarong Pambansa provided that they shall represent the School or Division or Region where they are enrolled.
 - c. In case of transfer of learner-athlete, the following rules shall apply, viz: i. ii. For transfer of athlete from one region to another region, a one (1) academic year or school year residency requirement shall be imposed only upon secondary student-athletes, except for those in Grade 7 and Grade 11. Transferees in the elementary level shall be allowed to play provided his/her transfer was made before or at the beginning of the school year. This provision shall also apply to Filipino student-athletes from other countries enrolling in a school in the Philippines.
- A one (1) academic year or school year residency shall commence at the beginning of the school year until the end of the current Palarong Pambansa.

ii. For individual event - Transferees from one school to another school within the Division or transferees from one Division to another Division within the same Region, are allowed to participate in the Palarong Pambansa, provided, they have participated in the lower meets, (School, District, Division, Regional);

iii. For team events (Basketball, Baseball, Futsal, Sepak Takraw, Volleyball, Softball and Football) - A student-athlete who transferred from one school within the Division or Region, shall be allowed to participate in the School, Division, Regional Meet and Palarong Pambansa, provided his/her transfer was made before the conduct of the school intramural.

d. For student-athletes in the **elementary level**, the athlete must have been **born on or after January 1, 2012**. For Palarong Pambansa 2026, elementary student-athletes must have been **born on or after January 1, 2013**; for 2027, on or after January 1, 2014; and so on and so forth for the succeeding years.

For those in the **secondary level**, the athlete must have been **born on or after January 1, 2007**. For Palarong Pambansa 2026, secondary studentathletes must have been born on or after **January 1, 2008**; for **2027, on or after January 1, 2009**; and so on and so forth for the succeeding years. Athletes born before said date shall be immediately disqualified from the School, Division, Regional Meet, and in the Palarong Pambansa for being overage.

e. Filipino athletes enrolled in Philippine School Overseas (PSOs) may be allowed to participate in the Palarong Pambansa (National Palaro) without playing in the Division and Regional Meets, provided that the athlete: i. Shall meet the other requirements for qualification and accreditation; ii. Shall meet the qualifying standards in the individual sports where they are playing; iii. Shall shoulder their expenses; and iv. For purposes of representation, they shall be playing under the banner of Philippine School Overseas (PSOs) and shall be exempted from the one (1) year residency requirement in case of athlete's transfer and the one school-one team rule representation in team events.

f. Athletes enrolled in the National Academy of Sports (NAS) shall be allowed to participate in the Palarong Pambansa without playing in the Division and Regional Meets, subject to the following conditions:

- i. NAS student-athletes must undergo with the usual Screening and Accreditation process and abide by the rules on the eligibility of athletes provided by the Palarong Pambansa Board;
- ii. NAS shall be the 18th delegation to the Palarong Pambansa, carrying the banner of the National Academy of Sports;
- iii. All expenses to be incurred relative to the participants of NAS as a separate delegation shall be shouldered by the NAS and that no additional expenses shall be charged to the Department of Education and/or Palarong Pambansa; and
- iv. Transfers of athlete/s from Region III delegation and other Regions to NAS shall be considered as transfer from one region to another region.

Section 7. Grounds for Disqualification - Unless otherwise provided by the Board, the following athletes shall be disqualified or shall not be allowed to play in the Palarong Pambansa, Regional, Division, or other lower meets: DeED MATATAG

- a. Athletes who have been declared over age;
- b. Elementary athletes with 3rd molar tooth;
- c. For Elementary and Secondary level: Athletes with failing grades in three (3) or more learning areas in the:
 - i. first grading period for the Division Level;
 - ii. second grading period for the Regional Level and Palarong Pambansa;
- d. Athletes who become, have been, or are currently members of the:
 - i. National Team, National Training Pool, or who played in the South East Asian (SEA) Games, Asian Youth Games, Asian Games and/or Olympic Games;
 - ii. National Developmental Pool and who received or are receiving regular monthly stipend and/or allowance from the Philippine Sports Commission (PSC); BAGONG PILIPINAS Provided, however, that those athletes who played in other foreign invitational competitions shall not be disqualified to play in the Palarong Pambansa: Provided, further, that athletes participating in one sports discipline as:
 - a) members of the National Team, National Training Pool;
 - b) National Developmental Pool and who received or are receiving monthly stipend and/or allowance from the Philippine Sports Commission (PSC) or played in the SEA Games, Asian Youth Games, Asian Games and/or Olympic Games shall not be disqualified to play in the Palarong Pambansa and other lower meets in a sports discipline other than the sport wherein the athlete participated in as a member of the above-mentioned team or pools;
 - e. Athletes who fail to submit the required documents, physically appear during the screening and interview, and play in the Regional, Division, and lower meets, unless his/her failure to appear is justifiable or due to a fortuitous event beyond his/her control;
 - f. g. Athletes banned during the previous Palarong Pambansa or disqualified during lower meets; and Other grounds include but are not limited to falsification of documents, misrepresentation, and use of prohibited drugs.

Section 8. Documentary Requirements.

The following are the required documents to be submitted by athletes who intend to participate in the Palarong Pambansa and other lower meets:

- a. Athlete's Record (AR) signed by the athlete, coach, and authorized Division Sports Officer and/or Coordinator;
- b. C. d. Original and certified photocopy of Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA)/National Statistics Office (NSO) Birth Certificate. **Late registration of the Birth Certificate** of an athlete shall be accepted, provided the Birth Certificate is registered one (1) year before the current Palarong Pambansa. For those athletes who participated in the previous Palarong Pambansa, only a photo copy of the PSA birth certificate is required.

In the case of foreign-born Filipino athletes, in lieu of an NSO/PSA Birth Certificate, the Original Birth Certificate issued by the country where he/she was born and a valid passport or a document issued by the Bureau of Immigration or Department of Foreign Affairs showing his or her Filipino nationality. The eligibilities are subject to the specific technical rules of each sports discipline.

Certified true copy from original or computer printed of Learner's Permanent Academic Record or School Form (SF) 10 (Form 137) with entries of Learner Reference Number (LRN) duly signed by the Teacher Adviser or Registrar or Principal, or School Heads, and by the authorized

Division Sports Coordinator, PESS Coordinator or Education Program Supervisor in charge of Sports.

e. Republic of the Philippines Department of Education OPERATIONS Division Sports Coordinator, PESS Coordinator or Education Program Supervisor in charge of Sports. Certificate of Enrolment and Attendance duly signed by the School Registrar or School Head:

- i. For Grades 1 to 10, a Certificate of Attendance and Completion stating that the athlete had attended and completed the Curriculum Year.
- ii. For Grades 11 and 12, the athlete must not have three or more failing final grades in any learning areas for the 1st semester;
- iii. For Grades 11 and 12, a Certificate of Completion issued by the school where the athlete was enrolled in the 2nd Semester, stating that the athlete had attended and completed the Curriculum Year. The foregoing requirements apply to Palarong Pambansa.
- iv. For the lower meets, Grades 1 to 10 must not have three (3) or more failing grades in any learning areas; likewise, in Grades 11 and 12, 1st semester grades must not have three (3) or more failing grades in any learning areas.

f. Parental Consent i. Combative sports, including gymnastics - Parental Consent signed by both parents duly verified by the school head, or principal, or registrar, or teacher-adviser where the athlete is enrolled.

1. In case one or both parent/sis /are residing in a place other than the athlete's residence, signed parent consent from both parents must be submitted and verified by the school head or principal, or registrar, or teacher-adviser where the athlete is enrolled. Copy of the signed parent consent of any parent maybe in electronic form (i.e., sent to the school head or coach through email or other electronic means.)

2. In case of de facto separation, legal separation, annulment of marriage, or declaration of nullity of marriage of parents, the consent of the parent with actual care and custody of the athlete duly verified by the school head or principal, or registrar, or teacher-adviser where the athlete is enrolled.

ii. **Non-combative sports** - Parental Consent of at least one parent duly verified by the school head or principal, or registrar, or teacher-adviser where the athlete is enrolled. 1. In case both parents are residing in a place other than the athlete's residence, signed parental consent from one parent must be submitted and verified by the school head where the athlete is enrolled. Copy of the signed parental consent of any parent may be in electronic form (i.e., sent to the school principal or coach through email or other electronic means.) iii. If the athlete is orphaned, has no known parents, or any other similar circumstances, the caregiver and custodian shall execute a Notarized Affidavit of Actual Care and Custody in lieu of the Parent's Consent. g. Medical certificate issued within three (3) months before the opening of each level of competition, stating that the athlete is physically fit and within the age limit required. The complete name and signature of the physician shall appear on the medical certificate, with the license number and date of examination. h. i. Dental certificate, with a universal entry, issued within six (6) months before each level of competition is opened. The complete name and signature of the dentist shall appear on the dental certificate, with the license number and date of examination. **For Secondary Athletes, No Dental Certificate is required. PasSport of the student-athlete containing the documents enumerated under Section 8 of this Rule and accessible through QR Code or password.**

j. Four (4) copies of passport size 1½ x 1 2, identical and clear pictures with name tag (surname, first name and middle initial) and with grade or year level, to be used for the Athlete's Record, Dental Certificate, Gallery and Accreditation Card. k. Affidavit of the coach, attesting to the authenticity, validity and correctness of the entries on the above-mentioned documents. 1. Additional documents for athletes in Special Sports Events for SWDL: BAGONG PILIPINAS (1.) **Intellectual Disability Certification** - Psycho-Educational Assessment Tests conducted and certified by Psychologist or DepEd SPED Supervisor indicating the athlete's IQ level (70 and below); (ii.) **Visual Impairment Certification** - test conducted and certified by an Ophthalmologist to determine the visual acuity (Totally Blind or Low Vision); and (iii.) **Hearing Impairment Certification** - test conducted and certified by an Otorhinolaryngologist to determine that the athlete is unable to hear.

RULE IV

Section 9.

Eligibility and Documentary Requirements for Coach and Assistant Coach - Any school (private or public) personnel may be allowed/designated as a coach or assistant coach, provided he/she meets and submits the following documentary requirements: a. He/she must be a Filipino citizen; b. Certificate of Relevant sports training of twenty-four (24) hours for noncombative sports and forty (40) hours for combative sports/ gymnastics; c. d. Certificate of Relevant experience of one (1) year for non-combative sports and two (2) years for combative sports/ gymnastics; Coach and assistant coach Track Record of participation in the Division and Regional Meet; e. Educational and professional attainment of at least 2nd-year college, preferably sports-related course; f. Certificate of Membership in any relevant sports association; or License or certifications/ accreditation issued by the National/ International Sports Association, authorized organization, or by the DepEd (Division, Region, or Central Office); g. Medical Records (Medical Certificate of Fitness); h. Employment/Appointment Paper or duly Notarized Contract of Service that shows at least six (6) months of employment/engagement in the public or private school before the Division meets; and i. Omnibus Affidavit.

j. Other requirements, including but not limited to, documents that will establish the coaches' competence, integrity and capability, and its legal relationship to the school and/or athletes to show accountability. Section 10. Qualification and Documentary Requirement for Chaperone (Certificate or any documents): a chaperone may be designated to accompany the athlete provided she meets the qualifications and submits the following documents duly issued by competent authorities, showing the following:

- a. Competence, integrity, capability, and relation to a school (i.e., Employment/ Appointment or Contract of Service showing at least six (6) months of employment/engagement in the public school or private school before the Division Meets, Regional Meet and Palarong Pambansa;
- b. Commitment that SHE will nurture female athletes only and shall not coach the athletes;
- c. Physically fit; for this purpose, a medical certificate is required;
- d. Other eligibility that the Paloro Board may require.

Section 11. Special Cases regarding discrepancies in the Livebirth of the athlete a. In case of discrepancy in the date of birth indicated in the PSA/NSO Birth Certificate and SF 10 (Form 137), the date of birth indicated in the PSA/NSO Birth Certificate shall prevail. As a remedy, the following additional requirements shall be submitted: i. Certificate of Live Birth issued by the Local Civil Registrar (LCR); ii. Joint Affidavit of two (2) disinterested persons attesting to the true date of birth of the athlete; iii. Resolution issued by the Head of the Delegation correcting the discrepancy in the SF 10 (Form 137).

b. In case of discrepancy in the name indicated in the PSA/NSO Birth Certificate and SF 10 (Form 137), the name indicated in the PSA/NSO Birth Certificate shall prevail. As a remedy, the following additional requirements shall be submitted: i. Certificate of Live Birth issued by the LCR; ii. Joint Affidavit of two (2) disinterested persons attesting to the true name of the athlete;

iii. Resolution issued by the Head of the Delegation correcting the discrepancy in the SF 10 (Form 137). c. In case the first or last name is not found at the portion of the first or last name entered in the PSA/NSO Birth Certificate but indicated in the box below of said portion, the following additional requirements shall be submitted:

e. f. i. Certificate of Live Birth issued by the LCR; ii. Copy of the application/petition duly received by the LCR (supplemental report to the LCR/Court); iii. Affidavit of the parents, attesting to the true first or last name of the athlete; iv. Joint Affidavit of two (2) disinterested persons attesting to the true first or last name of the athlete; v. Resolution issued by the Head of the Delegation attesting the athlete's true first or last name as shown in the foregoing records. In case an illegitimate child (athlete) uses the surname of his / her father as indicated in the SF 10 (Form 137), the following additional requirement shall be submitted: i. PSA/NSO Birth Certificate with the second page showing acknowledgment by the father or a notarized acknowledgment signed by the father. In case of unreadable entries in the PSA/NSO Birth Certificate, the following additional requirements shall be submitted: i. Certificate of Live Birth issued by the LCR; ii. Affidavit of the parents, attesting to the true and correct entries; iii. Joint Affidavit of two (2) disinterested persons attesting to the true entries; iv. Resolution issued by the Head of the Delegation attesting the true and correct entries as shown in the foregoing records.

In case the biological sex/gender of the athlete is not indicated in the PSA/NSO Birth Certificate, the following additional requirements shall be submitted: i. Certificate of Live Birth issued by the LCR; ii. Affidavit of the parents, attesting to the true and correct biological sex of the athlete; iii. Certification issued by the NSAC Medical Team attesting to the true and correct biological sex of the athlete after conducting a physical examination.

The above-mentioned Resolutions or Certification issued by the Head of Delegations or the NSAC shall be for purposes of Palaro only. **RULE VI Section 12.** Period of Screening, Interview, and Evaluation - Screening and evaluation of documents of the athletes, coaches, assistant coaches, and chaperones for the Palarong Pambansa may be conducted during or after the Regional Meet, or within seven (7) days before, and at the venue of, the Palarong Pambansa. For this purpose, the Head of the Delegations shall submit to the NSAC within fifteen (15) days after their Regional Meet the following, viz: a. A letter request indicating the schedule of the interview, screening, and evaluations of documents of the athletes, coaches, assistant coaches, and chaperones; b. Master list and photo galleries (soft and hard copies) of athletes, coaches, assistant coaches, and chaperones; and c. A certification stating that: They had screened and evaluated the athletes, coaches, assistant coaches and chaperones of the subject regional athletic delegation and shall certify that the attached documents are true, complete and correct to the best of their knowledge and belief, and they understand that any false information given, or any true information withheld from said documents may provide grounds for administrative disciplinary action.

Section 13. Posting of Master List to Websites The master lists and picture galleries of the athletes, coaches, assistant coaches, and chaperones shall be posted on the DepEd website or any available website upon submission by the delegation concerned. The Communications Division of the Department shall facilitate the immediate posting on the DepEd website or on any available website of the submitted master list and/or photo galleries of athletes, coaches, assistant coaches, and chaperones upon receipt of the said master lists and galleries subject to the provision of the Data Privacy Act.

Section 14. Protest on Eligibility and Appeals on Disqualification a. Complaints or protests shall be in writing duly signed by the coach and the Head of the Delegation or his or her representative and shall be filed before the NSAC within five (5) days from the first day of publication of the master list of qualified athletes on the DepEd Website or submitting it to the Palaro Board through the Palarong Pambansa Secretariat. The complaint or protest shall be resolved within five (5) days from receipt hereof. b. Complaint/Protest shall be accompanied by affidavit/s of witnesses and/or pieces of evidence in support thereof; c. Protests that do not comply with (a) and (b) hereof shall not be given due course by the NSAC, without prejudice to the re-filing of the same upon compliance with the abovementioned requirements; d. The decision on the complaint or protest shall be appealable to the Board within five (5) days from the issuance of the decision, and the Board shall resolve the appeal within fifteen (15) days from receipt of the complaint or protest. e. All complaints/protests and appeals must be resolved with finality within thirty (30) days from receipt of the complaint or protest.

Section 15. Replacement of Athletes, Coaches, and Chaperones Replacement of athletes, coaches and chaperones may be allowed based on meritorious grounds one (1) month before the Palaro and upon the written request by the Head of the Regional Delegation: Provided, that in case of illness and other fortuitous events, replacement maybe allowed two (2) days before the Palarong Pambansa. For team events: Replacements particularly in team sports shall be drawn from registered alternates that emanate from the school team.

Section 16. Fielding of the NSAC members to the Palaro Venue The NSAC members shall be at the Palaro venue within seven (7) days before the schedule of the opening of the Palarong Pambansa to continue the performance of their duties and responsibilities and during the period of the Palaro events to recheck and monitor the athletes, coaches, assistant coaches, and chaperones fielded during the games by the delegations.

Section 17. Sanctions against Athletes, Technical Officials, and Other Individuals involved - Unless otherwise provided for by the Board, the following sanctions shall be imposed against the athletes, coaches, chaperones and team of the Region who will violate the rules on eligibility: a. In team competitions, the games where the ineligible and/or disqualified athlete has taken part shall be declared forfeited in favor of the opposing team; b. In individual competitions, the games where the ineligible and/or disqualified athlete played shall be forfeited in favor of the opposing athlete; c. With respect to sanctions that will be imposed against individuals who caused the violation of the rules on eligibility, he/she may be suspended from participating in future school sports competitions, the duration of which shall be one (1) to three (3) years depending on the gravity of the offense: Provided, that he/she shall suffer the penalty of perpetual disqualification from participating in any future school sports competition in case of violations which are intentional and willful. d. These sanctions shall be without prejudice to the filing of appropriate administrative and/or criminal charges against the erring officials and/or athletes in accordance with existing laws, rules, and regulations. **Section 18.** Repealing Clause - All DepEd issuances regarding the eligibility of athletes, coaches, assistant coaches, and chaperones or part thereof which are inconsistent with these Guidelines are hereby repealed, amended, or modified accordingly.
